Cases with infractions that violate more than one *Handbook* policy are recorded with multiple votes. This allows the Board to more accurately capture the nuances of a specific infraction. The totals in blue reflect the number of cases decided by the Board while the subheadings reflect the number of violations.

**Beginning in 2015-2016, the Administrative Board is no longer responsible for hearing cases of academic dishonesty. This chart includes statistics that bridge the transition; for example, the relieve from probation line indicates, for 2015-2016, those students who were relieved from disciplinary probation under the Board's jurisdiction, not those placed on probation by the Honor Council.
